



# 1. What is the Franciscan University High School Advantage Partnership Program?

- Allows qualified students to enroll in Franciscan University courses that align with their existing high school curriculum prior to high school graduation.
- Eliminates geographic barriers to Franciscan University learning and resources.
- Decreases the cost of a Franciscan University education to families.
- Enhances the access to Franciscan University education and formation for students and families.

#### 2. Who will teach the Franciscan Advantage courses?

- Your high school teachers will teach the course.
- Students will concurrently enroll in a Franciscan Advantage course and complete Franciscan assessments.
- Direct instruction between Franciscan University faculty and the high school students is limited.

#### 3. Where/When will Franciscan Advantage courses be taught?

- These courses will be taught at the student's school during the normal school day.
- Students are enrolled concurrently in their high school class and the Franciscan class.

#### 4. What is the cost?

• As a result of the partnership between Franciscan University and high schools across the nation, Franciscan Advantage Partnership course tuition is \$100 per credit hour. This will be billed directly by Franciscan University.

#### 5. How many credits may a student earn?

• Currently, students may earn up to 29 credits at Franciscan University prior to high school graduation. Students earn grades and an official transcript.

#### 6. How will student learning be evaluated by Franciscan?

• Franciscan University faculty will create a midterm exam and final exam, which will be administered on the University's learning management system during the normal school day. Students will need to use two-factor authentication for security purposes.

#### 7. What are the timelines for application registration?

• Priority course registration must be completed **NO LATER** than September 15.

## 8. Where can students use these Franciscan credits?

• Credits earned are immediately applied to Franciscan University. In most cases, credits earned at Franciscan are transferable to other colleges and universities. Each college or university has its own policies regarding transferability of credits. Each student may request a transcript with grades and credits earned by going to franciscan.edu/registrar. Select "Transcript Request." Next, click "Transcripts from Parchment" and follow the prompts to order your credentials. Current students can go to ACCESS FUS which will transfer you to the PORT or go to port.franciscan.edu and select the link for "Transcript Request" under student. Please create a new account using a personal email, not a Franciscan University email.

## 9. What other benefits are available for students in the Franciscan Advantage Program?

- Students who complete and pass one course automatically receive a \$2,000 scholarship each year for four years at Franciscan University.
- Students who complete and pass three courses are automatically accepted into Franciscan University.
- Students can also take part in our unique Franciscan Life Online for community and faith formation.

## 10. What are the eligibility requirements?

- Junior or senior year in high school.
- Minimum age of 16.
- Possess a cumulative 2.4 GPA or higher (on a 4.0 scale).

## 11. What is Franciscan University of Steubenville?

- Franciscan University is one of only 15 Catholic universities endorsed by the Cardinal Newman Society.
- Franciscan University was founded in 1946 by friars of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis of Penance (TOR) of the Province of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.
