

Dual Enrollment

Franciscan University is proud to offer this Advantage Program for dual enrollment to rising high school juniors and seniors. Students must be 16 years of age and up and possess a minimum 2.4 GPA.

The first step is the application which is free, quick, and easy: franciscan.edu/advantage-apply

All courses are asynchronous, with prerecorded videos, readings, and weekly assignments. The cost is only \$450 for a 3-credit dual enrollment college course. This is an 85 percent reduction in cost as compared to the in-person tuition rate. After you apply and are admitted, you will be registered in the courses indicated on your application. High school students are eligible to take a maximum of 2 courses per semester with a maximum of 36 dual enrolled credits (12 courses). If dual enrolled students complete 3 or more courses with a 3.0 GPA, they are automatically accepted into Franciscan University.

Dual enrolled high school students become part of the Franciscan University Online learning community. You are issued a Franciscan ID and email, have access to our Franciscan Life Online Faith Formation, our University library, our Writing Center, and our Student Success Center as well as many live and recorded talks and presentations.

There are many "advantages" to enrolling in our dual enrollment program.
